# Oral blending and segmenting

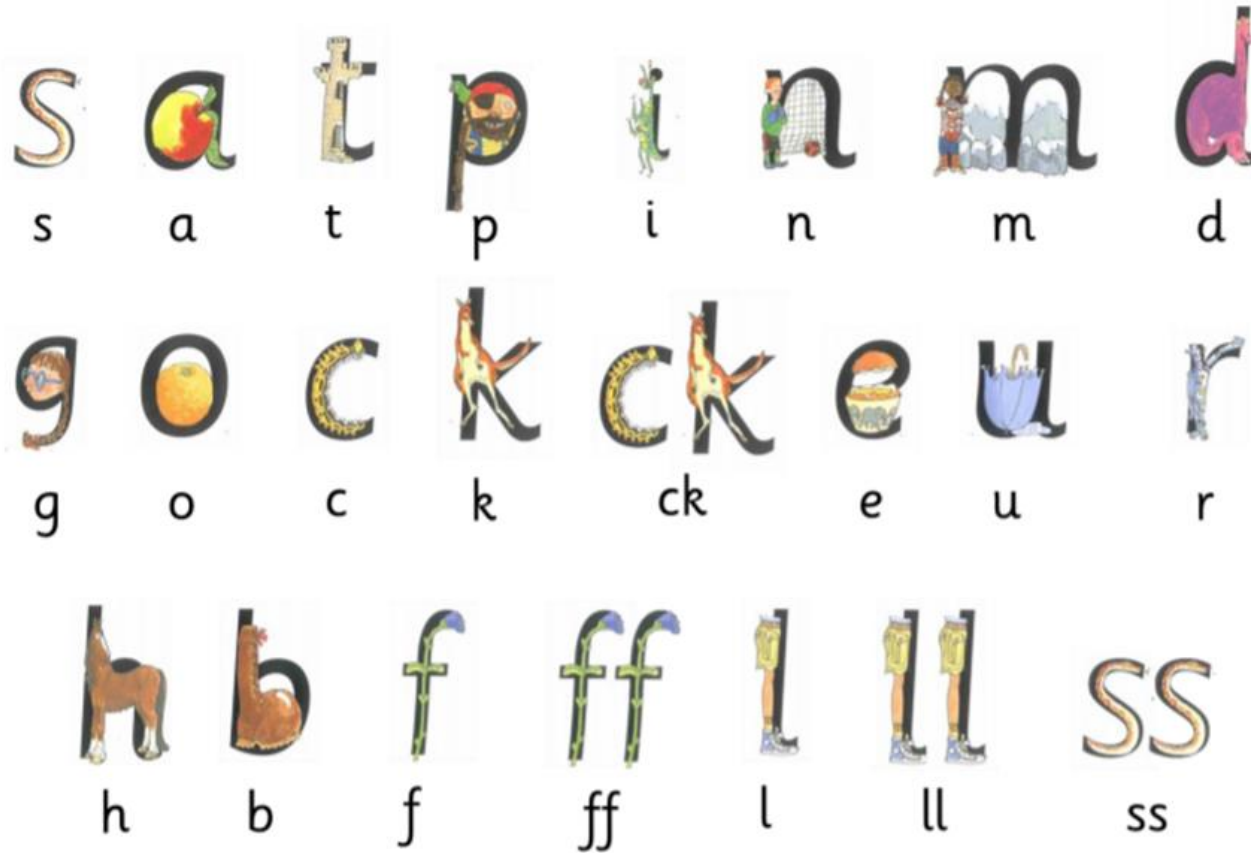
- Phase 1 quick activities e.g. robot talk
- 'robot voice'
- Can the children hear the sounds?
- Correct pronunciation is key

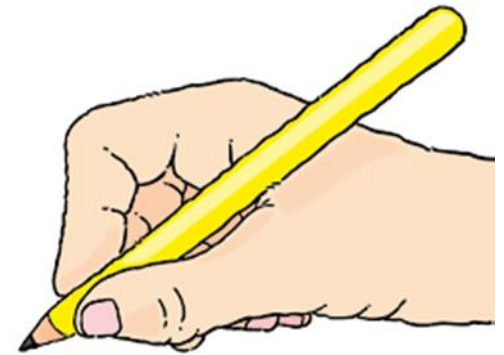
Correct pronunciation is needed to support early reading and spelling skills

# Letter formation

- Correct formation is introduced with each Sound
- Formation rhymes
- Pinchy Parrot

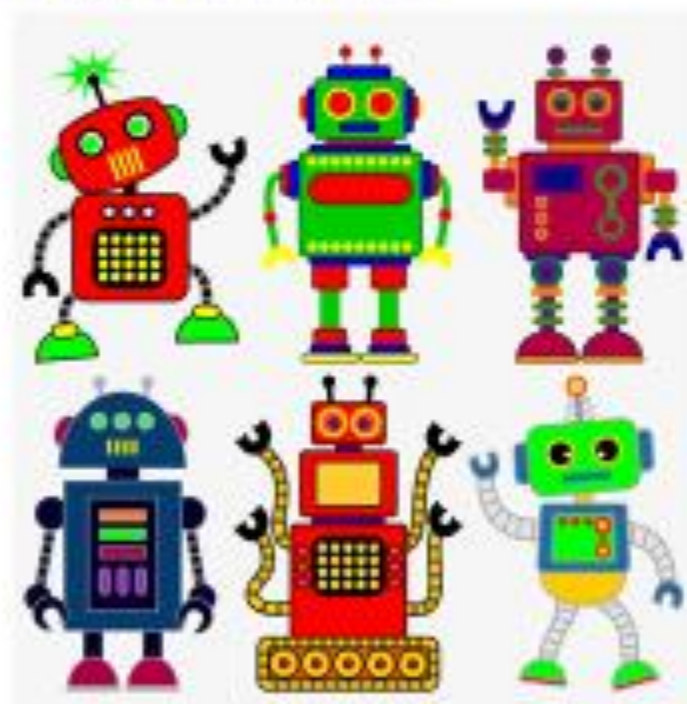


# Strategies for spelling

- Pull it out like a piece of chewing gum



- Robot arms/talk



# Apply

- Application of skill into reading/writing
- Shared reading/writing to begin with
- Apply into writing short captions
- Apply into reading short captions
- Looking at texts and spotting the sounds/words for reading

*Application continues with home reading of decodable books*

# Secure in Phase 2

By the end of Phase Two children should:

- give the sound when shown any Phase Two letter, securing first the starter letters
  - s, a, t, p, i, n;
  - find any Phase Two letter, from a display, when given the sound;
  - be able to orally blend and segment CVC words;
  - be able to blend and segment in order to read and spell (using magnetic letters)
- VC words such as: if, am, on, up and 'silly names' such as ip, ug and ock;
- be able to read the five tricky words the, to, I, no, go.

- Daily reading of phonics school book, please log in reading record.
- *Re-read, re-read, re-read*
- Practise using the sound flashcards to support blending
- Encourage correct letter formation when writing at home
