

To look at photos from the past and notice differences linked to farming and compare with farming in the village today e.g. use of horses and tractors.


Explore the changes that take place in Spring time and describe what they see, hear and feel whilst outside.

Develop curiosity and interest by exploring habitats of a snail.


Comment on images of familiar situations in the past- Todwick before the houses. Looking at how humans have impacted on green spaces.
